AUSTRALIA

 The Sydney Morning Herald
 INDEPENDENT. ALWAYS.

is a quality daily newspaper published in Sydney and founded in 1831. Its general editorial's stance is centrist. It has the largest readership in Australia.


 THE AUSTRALIAN
 THE HEART OF THE NATION

is a broadsheet newspaper published in Australia since 1964. Its editorial line is said to be centre-right to right wing. It was founded by Rupert Murdoch. It is the only Australian daily newspaper distributed nationwide.

CANADA

 TORONTO STAR

is a Canadian broadsheet daily newspaper that was founded in 1892, also known as *The Star*. It has one of the highest readership along with *The Globe and Mail*. Social liberalism is its political alignment = centre-left.


 THE GLOBE AND MAIL

is a Canadian broadsheet newspaper that is distributed in five cities in western and central Canada. It is 177 years old, and its editorial line is said to be centre-right.

IRELAND

 THE IRISH
 Sun

is the Irish edition of *The Sun* (UK). It is a tabloid newspaper that shares articles and pictures with its sister in Great Britain but has mainly Irish news and editorial content. Eurosceptic, conservative, right-wing are its political alignment, and it is owned by Rupert Murdoch.


 Irish Independent

used to be a broadsheet quality paper, but it introduced a compact size (tabloid format) in 2004. It is conservative and populist unlike *The Examiner*, another Irish quality paper.

SOUTH AFRICA

Mail & Guardian

is a weekly quality paper published in South Africa (compact size). Formerly known as *Weekly Mail*, it was renamed *Mail & Guardian* because it criticised the governmental Apartheid policies and was banned by President Gotha in 1988.

THE UNITED-KINGDOM

theguardian

is a national British daily quality newspaper. It was founded in 1821. It is now of a compact size (Berliner) but was a broadsheet for over 195 years. Its editorial line is centre-left (Labour and some Lib Dem).

The Daily Telegraph

is a national British daily conservative broadsheet newspaper paper. Its motto is “Was, is and will be”. Boris Johnson (British Prime Minister in 2021) worked for the paper as a Brussels former correspondent.

The Economist

is an international weekly newspaper with a magazine format. It focuses on international affairs, politics, business and technology. It is based in London and was created in 1843.

USA

The New York Times

is an American daily broadsheet newspaper. It is ranked third in the US by circulation. It was founded in 1851 and backs up liberal ideas (= democratic). Its motto is “All the News That’s Fit to Print”.

USA TODAY

is an American daily middle-market newspaper (important news events and entertainment). It is ranked first in the US by circulation. It was founded in 1982 and is of centre-right alignment.

Los Angeles Times

or *LA Times* is a daily newspaper based in California. It was founded in 1881. It is the largest paper which is headquartered on the West Coast.

Newsweek

is a Republican-leaning American weekly news magazine. The first issue was released in 1933 with a famous cover with Nazi flags. It ceased print format in 2012, but two years later returned its profitability.
